## HEALING GREEN GROUP

Well, the hot and very dry weather has continued from April into May and looks like being much the same into June. It could be the driest Spring period in the past 70 years or even an all-time record. At the moment (mid May) things are still looking fairly green though the moss in my lawn is definitely turning brown now (but that may be a good thing). The trees and plants we planted around the Moated Settlement are mostly doing well with last years trees all with healthy looking leaves. Unfortunately, one of the walnut trees came a cropper as I hadn't marked it up well enough and the lawn mower got it. By far the best performing flower plant is the Water Avens which has become a goodly sized bush with multiple attractive flower spikes. However, the ground and ponds are drying out very rapidly now so for how much longer this will continue is a definite concern. I am applying some water to some of the plants two or three times a week. Fortunately, I have ten or so water butts so shouldn't run out of rainwater but may run out of time to save everything as there are so many. Anyway, it's the survival of the fittest and we just have to adapt - perhaps a few cacti next year.

The hawthorn May blossom is a lovely sight at the moment with a striking range of white, cream and pinks (there are quite a few different varieties of hawthorn both native and naturalised). You can tell it's hawthorn and not blackthorn as there will be leaves and flowers on the branches. There are lots of pagan superstitions and traditions to do with hawthorn (May garlands, Green Man, etc) and it should never be taken inside a house as bad things will happen!!!!. The blackthorn at the Moated Settlement is growing fast and popping up everywhere. Some trimming back will be undertaken to stop it being too much of good-thing/nuisance - like the nettles and brambles.

Lots of people are using and enjoying the paths around the Settlement which is so good to see. Even more encouraging was an unexpected encounter with two young lads one evening while I was watering. They enquired if I was planting trees and things. They were equipped with a spade, small fork and other bits and bobs and were on a mission - to set up a Bug Hotel. We had a good chat, went through some ideas and I told them this is just the sort of thing we want to do around the Site. The "Hotel" has been constructed with around 6 stories and plenty of rooms from timber and wire mesh. With time it will trap and collect foliage and should attract a good range of tenants. Very Well Done.

### View from the Pew

What causes you to worry in your life? There seems to be plenty to worry about now. World situations and disputes. Political changes. Climate change. Then of course there are your own personal situations. Maybe ill health or struggling with finances or family tensions. Maybe you feel very lonely.

But God wants to help you in all your situations. At times it does not seem that he is there to help. God seems remote. But we need to believe in His presence and make space in our lives to be aware of that presence. Often, we are too busy with all our activities

Most of us know the 23rd Psalm. *The Lord is my shepherd I shall not want.* Is that your experience. Dave Hopwood gives us a reflection on that Psalm which I find very helpful. I quote it with his permission.

*Lord, for ourselves, for those we care for, and for those who lead us at all levels, please would you be our shepherd today.*

*Guiding us, providing what we need, for the situations we all face.*

*When the going is rough may there be strength, when the valleys are dark may there be light, when our resources are low may there be replenishment, when weariness takes hold may we find streams of refreshment, and calm inspiration.*

*When we are afraid may we sense you beside us.*

*Guide us we pray, lead us and help us, and may we follow in your footprints today. Amen*

There are many ways to pray, just as we all have different ways of communicating with our friends. It doesn't need to always be eloquent, but at times it's helpful to use words. Our relationship with God should aim for that intimacy. Is that what you want to help you with your worries?



## **GASP Update, May 2025**

GASP (Grimsby Area Swift Project) was set up in 2021 in response to evidence that Swift numbers in this country have declined by more than 60% in the last 30 years. A major cause of this decline is believed to be a reduction in the number of suitable nest holes through demolition and modification of buildings.

As well as installing nest boxes for Swifts on existing buildings, (and nearly 75 have been installed in Healing, nearby villages and the less prosperous areas in Grimsby) GASP aims to persuade local authorities and builders to include Swift boxes or bricks on properties, particularly 'new builds'.

This work continues but what can you do to help?

Fit a swift box if property suitable, i.e. at least 5m (16ft) above ground/not in full sun/clear flight path in and out

Report where Swifts are present and particularly entering/leaving buildings which indicates nesting.

Also, these events are supported by Healing Manor who provide a free dessert/cake for the events. A big thank you to Healing Academy staff, pupils and Healing Manor for supporting these events.

The Christmas event saw carol singing around the tree outside of the Hall with refreshments afterwards.

We also had a new venture with Christmas wreath making which was extremely popular and this will be run again for 2025.

The Ward Councillors for the Wolds Ward, which includes Healing Village, were Cllrs. David Hasthorpe and Henry Hudson, with Cllr. Hasthorpe attending the majority of the Parish Council meetings.

The Parish Council complied with the requirements of the audit regulations and advertised a period for electors to inspect the accounts should they wish to do so. The Parish Council also publishes its financial information on its website during the year.

### General Matters

During the financial year 25/26 the main project was the redecoration of the Village Hall an upgrading some of its facilities and works to the park on Fords Avenue with new equipment etc. Thanks to our Ward Cllrs., Cllr. Henry Hudson and David Hasthorpe for ward funding to help us deliver this and other projects.

The Parish Council continues to maintain a dialogue with the local policing team, although there is very limited attendance at meetings, but monthly written reports continue to be received.

The Parish Council organised the Remembrance Day Event in November in liaison with the Royal British Legion, which was very well attended as always. During the year the Council continued its new programme of events. The quiz nights were very popular, with 3 being held and thanks to all those who have attended. There are usually around 50 people at each quiz and they are proving very popular.

Newsletter - £12,700 which covers printing and distribution costs and which is offset slightly by advertising revenue. The Parish Council did review the production of the Newsletter during the year but resolved to maintain the current operational basis for it.

Maintenance of the park sites - £14,623

Events - £6,626 which included the summer holiday clubs, the Christmas event, the Summer event and entertainment and then the senior's lunches.

Highways/Footpaths/Land management - £4,344 on grass cutting and general maintenance, tree maintenance on the sites owned by the Council and works on the Healing Moated Site which are being overseen by the Green Group headed by Cllr. Dave Spreadborough.

General admin - £9,997 which covers insurances, subscriptions to local authority organisations, training, stationery and office expenses, website provision, internal and external audit services, maintenance of the defibrillators under a contract with LIVES and any necessary repairs.

As with each year, the Parish Council met to set the precept and agree its budget in January 2024 for the coming year 25/26 and during the year the Council complied with its statutory requirements to have both an internal and external audit carried out. The Council's internal auditor for the year was Mr. M. Peterson and the external auditor (appointed through the DCLG) was PKF Littlejohn, based in Canary Wharf, London. There were no required outcomes from the audit which was conducted.

Other income came from the following sources:

- Hall Revenue - £13,008
- Newsletter advertising - £1920
- VAT reclaimed from previous year - £3,539
- Ward Cllr. funding - £1,500
- Events Income – £2,149
- Energy Refund - £6,500
- Bowling Club Payment - £1,000

Basic expenditure was as follows:

Village Hall expenditure - £18,860 (excluding the costs of staffing) this includes some new equipment, loan repayment against loan taken towards new hall build, water rates, the Performing Rights Society licence, heating and lighting and general everyday maintenance and repairs and a proportion of the insurance cover of the Council. Business rates were levied this year.

Staffing costs - £29,867 which covers 6 permanent staff positions – the Parish Clerk, four staff positions at the Village Hall and 1 position for a litter picker. The expenditure includes staff salaries, relief/holiday cover for the village hall, administration and all Inland Revenue PAYE payments, pension contributions and Employer's Liability cover. Rates for salaries are set either with national living wage rates or through NALC for Government Officers salary scales.

Donations - £800 which goes to the Church to assist with its grass cutting maintenance.

The Parish Council also committed during the year to include new play equipment and improved park facilities in its budget each year and a new piece of inclusive equipment will be purchased during 25/26 for Poplar Road park.

For the two park areas, the Parish Council is responsible for grass cutting, hedge cutting, tree maintenance, playground equipment inspection and maintenance, emptying the bins, tennis court maintenance and also the Bowling Green maintenance.

The Healing Bowling Club donate towards the maintenance of the bowling green which it uses as its home ground.

The costs of maintaining the Parks for the year totalled £14,623 excluding any new equipment but covering grass cutting, insurances, repairs to existing equipment etc. The Parish Council is also responsible for business rates, insurance and utility costs for water and energy. NELC supports the Parish Council by reimbursing the costs for essential maintenance of grass cutting, hedge cutting and emptying of the bins. NELC repays the Parish Council approximately £6.5k towards the maintenance costs incurred during the year.

**Finance**

The precept set by the Parish Council for 24/25 was £72,500.

## Healing Village Hall

The Village Hall continues to be very busy with regular groups and clubs on weekdays and is very popular at weekends for private hires/family parties etc.

During the year revenue generated from Hall usage was £13,008 this is a slight decrease on the previous year's figure but the indoor bowling club finally finished after very many years in the Hall. But towards the end of the year some new hiring slots have come into operation.

## Land ownership

The Parish owns the Moated Manor Site, Cornflower Copse and land at Quantock Gardens. It also leases Porri's Wood, Fords Avenue Park and Poplar Road Park from NELC.

Routine maintenance is built in each year for the sites.

The Parish Council conducts bi-annual inspections of all of its Sites, as required by the insurance cover and submits a report to the Council meetings for works to be agreed and then carried out.

During the year being reported, NELC finally removed the old play equipment from the small area to the side of Fords Avenue Park, which it still maintains ownership of and the Parish Council purchased and installed a new basket style swing on the park to replace the old 'mound' feature with the tunnel which no longer adhered to health and safety standards. The new basket swing is proving very popular.

## For Year 24/25

During the year members of the public, Ward Councillors and development team representatives attended the meetings. The agendas for meetings are published approximately one week before the meetings and meetings are held in the new Village Hall.

There are 10 available seats on the Parish Council and vacancies remained throughout the year.

Members also attended a Planning Meeting which was an extra meeting and also a Personnel Committee meeting.

Councillors also served and represented Healing on various outside bodies at meetings including the Town and Parish Liaison Committee held with NELC and the ERNLLCA District Meetings.

Councillors and the Clerk also regularly attend training sessions provided through NELC, NALC, the local County Association and the Society of Local Council Clerks. During the year the Chairman and the Clerk attended the Local Government Conference in Hull.

#### Parish Clerk

The Parish Clerk for the year was Kathy Peers, a CiLCA qualified Clerk. Mrs. Peers is also an associate member of the Society of Local Council Clerks (SLCC) and undertakes ongoing training through the local County Association and the SLCC.

### **Planning Matters**

The Parish Council is a statutory consultee of the local Planning Authority, which is North East Lincolnshire Council. The Parish Council is consulted on every planning application within the Parish and also those which are on its boundary or close to its boundary within a neighbouring Parish.

During the course of the year 29 planning applications and/or planning appeals were considered which is an increase on the previous year. Consultations were also received, mainly on potential industrial projects in the parish area or adjacent.

Drawings and other information pertaining to each planning application are downloaded and projected at each meeting for both Members and the public in attendance to see.

All planning applications and comments made by the Parish Council are published each month in the Healing Village News and are contained in the minutes published on the Parish Council website.

### **Healing Village Newsletter**

The Parish Council continued with the Newsletter throughout the year. The Newsletter goes to every household in the village and this is carried out by a team of local Healing-based young people who act as a distribution team for the Parish Council.

Although village groups advertise their events for free and publish monthly reports, advertising space is professionally sold within the magazine and this income helps to support the cost of producing the Newsletter. Advertising brought in £1,920 revenue during the year which is a decrease on previous years.

The Newsletter is now being printed in full colour and is well received.

The Parish Council is grateful to all those who have advertised their services or business during 24/25 through the Newsletter and also to the local village groups who submit their articles for each edition.
