The Council meeting for June was held in the new Village Hall at the new later time of 7.30 pm.

The evening started with the Annual Parish Meeting for Healing and then the usual monthly Parish Council meeting followed on from that.

Highways and Footpaths

Amended proposals had now been received from NELC over traffic issues around the Primary School and these were now being progressed at NELC. The Parish Council had been in support of residents' initial objections to the original plans and these had now been shelved with only parking restrictions included as part of the proposed scheme.

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

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POLICE REPORT

Wolds Ward Healing Update June 2022

Crime

There were forty two reported crimes across the Wolds Ward during May. Of these, the following have occurred in Healing.


