The October meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday 11th October 2022 at 7.30 pm at Healing Village Hall as usual.

There were some members of the public present at the meeting as well as Ward Cllr. representation from NELC.

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


## **Hedge and Tree Maintenance**

As we move into a new Government leadership it seems we are heading into a winter of industrial action, rising prices and more deprivation. I don't not think I have seen so much unrest and potential hardship in my 67 years I lived on this earth. I was born in what would be seen now as a deprived and needy family, my father was a farm worker, my mother had three part time jobs and we lived a 3-bedroom cottage with no running hot water or central heating with my grandparents. We had a primitive situation and no bathroom. It wasn't until I was about 12 my father changed his job, and we moved to Lincoln, that we became acceptable in society, yet down the fen, we were happy. There was never a time when I or my sister would come home from school, and there wasn't an adult in the house ready to give us a hug and ask how we had got on that day. I think the epitome of love and devotion was our dog who every day would walk down to the crossroads, about ¼ of a mile from the house, sit and wait for me to come home, then go back and sit and wait for my sister, he wasn't happy until we were both home and safe. We lived very hand to mouth until we moved, then it all changed we became part of society in an affluent area of Lincoln and our lives were never the same.

The question is what are we striving for, are we constantly looking for a better life with more material possessions, or are we looking for a more settled life where we know and are surrounded by people who love us for what we are. Dennis my brother-in-law had a very simple outlook on what was important, first was God, then family followed by everything else. Once you have sorted out what is important, then the rest just melt away. What is important to you?
